Nature & Scope of Language \Rightarrow The nature of Language is based on certain linguistic principles which

are given below -

I. Language is a system. \Rightarrow Language is a complex system which functions through sounds, words & structures. These elements of language are interlinked. They do not express any idea if uttered in isolation. They are combined to communicate ideas.

II. Language is learnt \Rightarrow Language is an acquired social activity. It is learnt in a natural way. The child learns the language from his environment while interacting with his family members.
